LA CROIX COHINIAC



Turn right on rue Henri Sanson and at the corner of rue de la Frottrais, notice on the right the Croix Cohiniac (16th century), Christ on the cross surmounted by a batière and on the back, the Virgin and thr child.

THE MILL



Then stop at the Moulin de Buglais, built in the 16th century by the monks of the Abbey of Saint-Jacut (guided tour in season with the Tourist Office).

THE OLD PRESBYTERY



Turn right on allée du Chapitre, continue between the barriers to reach allée de la Musardière and you will see the old presbytery at n° 24 rue de la République.

THE HIGHEST POINT



Via rue Pierre L'Hotelier, go to the hillock of the Moulin de la Roche, the highest point in Lancieux (47m), to enjoy the viewpoint. Then discover the hollow path "La Croix Serjeul" in granite (17th century base).

RUE DES ÉCOLES



Join the rue des Écoles. In front of the n ° 7 bis, a small granite cross erected here reminds the place of the murder of a priest committed here, during the revolution, while he was going to the Church.

HAMLET OF LA METTRIE



Crossing the countryside, find the hamlet of La Mettrie with its old buildings, its Calvary with a cast-iron Christ on a wooden cross dating from the 1st half of the 20th century. Follow the circuit to rue Jules Jeunet, you can discover a sunken lane on the right before reaching the municipal campsite.

RUE DE LA MAIRIE



Turn left and take rue de la Mairie (late 19th century / Old school). You will also notice the Post Office (from 1934 designed by J. Gratien, architect).



- 1 LES HAUTS-BUGLAIS



Take avenue des Ajoncs to discover the Hauts-Buglais district and its side streets designed in 1930 and which boomed in the 1960s. Enjoy the magnificent panorama overlooking Saint-Jacut-de-la-Mer and the Island of Ebihens.

2 LA VILLA BOIS FLEURI



Join the Lancieux seaside resort with its villas dating from the late 19th century such as "Le Bois Fleuri" at the corner of rue de la Plage and boulevard Masera.

3 THE OLD BELL TOWER



Go up rue de la Source [Watch out for the climb!] to reach the old bell tower dating from 1740, the only vestige of the old church.

4 THE OLD TOWN



Take rue d'Armor, the old post office is located at n ° 7. Turn right, rue du Vieux Clocher to cross the old town, typical of rural settlements in 1800 and where at least 5 farms were located there. Join rue de l'Eglise by turning right onto rue du Centre.

5 THE CHURCH



Pass in front of the church completed in 1902 and take the rue nationale on the left.
